PAPER – IX

Project work/Dissertation and Viva-voce:

Students are required to submit a dissertation on a topic relevant to the PG Diploma Course in Women's Studies' syllabus during second semester. The dissertation will be assigned under the guidance of the faculties in theCentre in 2^{nd} Semester. This may be done in house or reputed universities/ colleges or private bodies as the case may be. The method to conduct and write dissertation will be taught in the course.

The student has to submit two bound copies of Research Dissertation Report to the Co-ordinator/ Director of the Centre before the Viva-voce. The allotment of the students to a faculty for supervision shall be done by the Departmental Committee. The type of research project (qualitative, quantitative or combined) should be based on the consensual decision of both the student and the supervisor.
