#### Pattern of the Question Paper :-

- (a) Question No. 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5 will be Long Answer type questions based on the five movements of Unit - II - one from each. Out of these five, the examinees will have to attempt any three. Each question will carry 20 marks. (3 x 20 = 60)
- (b) Question No. 6 will be short Answer type questions, in which there will be eight questions -four from Unit - I and four from Unit - II. Examinees will have to answer five questions selecting at least two questions from each unit. Each question will carry 8 marks. (5 x 8 = 40)

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#### Pattern of the Question Paper :-

- (a) Question No. 1, 2, 3 & 4 will be Long Answer type questions asked from each of the four units respectively. These questions will be based on the prescribed authors and their works. Each question will have an optional question (internal choice) and they will be of 15 marks each. (4 x 15 = 60)
- (b) Question No. 5 will be for explanation of passages with reference to the context. Examinees will have to explain three passage - two from Unit -I (with internal option) and one from Unit - II (with internal option). (3 x 5 =15)
- (c) Question No. 6 will be short Answer type. Examinees will have to answer any five out of eight questions asked (Two each from the four units). Each question will be of 5 marks. (5 x 5 = 25)
