Ayodhya, July 26, 2026: During the distribution ceremony of the 'Chief Minister's Teacher Cashless Medical Card' held at the Swami Vivekananda Auditorium of Dr. Rammanohar Lohia Avadh University, Vice-Chancellor Dr. Bijendra Singh described the initiative as a historic and public-welfare-oriented move by the state government. 'Miyawaki Garden' inaugurated at Awadh University; a new initiative for environmental conservation

Preserving trees ensures the safety of human civilization: Vice-Chancellor Dr. Bijendra Singh

Ayodhya, July 12, 2026. A massive tree plantation drive was organized at the new campus of Dr. Rammanohar Lohia Awadh University under the directives of the Uttar Pradesh government and the chairmanship of Vice-Chancellor Dr. Bijendra Singh. On this occasion, the Vice-Chancellor inaugurated a 'Miyawaki Garden' within the university campus. Plants of local species will be planted in this special garden—being developed over an area of approximately 3,200 square meters—to foster biodiversity by creating a dense green zone in a short span of time.

Speaking on the occasion, Vice-Chancellor Dr. Bijendra Singh remarked that forests are the most precious gift bestowed upon human civilization by nature. Life on Earth, environmental balance, and biodiversity are inconceivable without them. He noted that the Miyawaki technique is a scientifically highly effective method, enabling the development of dense forests in limited spaces at a rate many times faster than traditional forests. Planting local species will help conserve biodiversity and assist

in tackling global challenges such as climate change.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that the uni-

versity's Miyawaki Garden would not merely be a site for tree plantation but would be developed as a 'Living Green Laboratory' for study and research in fields such as environmental science, botany, zoology, agriculture, civil engineering, ecology, carbon sequestration, and climate change. He urged students and faculty members

to adopt at least one sapling and take responsibility for its care. He emphasized that the message of Indian cul-

The university considered this to be against the interests of students, contrary to the integrity of the evaluation process, and a serious violation of the Code of Ethics prescribed for teachers and principals. The university administration made it clear that no irregularity or negligence in the examination system will be tolerated at any level.
