104 meritorious students received 120 gold medals at the 31st convocation ceremony of Awadh University

Ayodhya, August 12, 2026. The 31st convocation ceremony of Dr. Rammanohar Lohia Avadh University concluded with grandeur on Wednesday, presided over by the Governor of Uttar Pradesh and Chancellor of the University, Smt. Anandiben Patel. During the ceremony, the Chancellor awarded 120 gold medals to 104 meritorious students. Female students demonstrated exceptional talent by securing 86 of these gold medals. Additionally, 166,055 undergraduate and postgraduate degrees and marksheets were uploaded to DigiLocker.

Addressing the convocation, the Chancellor congratulated the students receiving degrees and medals, stating that the purpose of education is not merely to obtain a degree but also to cultivate values, ethics, self-respect, and a sense of social responsibility. A university is not just a center for awarding

Highlighting the university's achievements, she noted that Avadh University has established a distinct identity at both national and international levels. The university secured the 138th rank nationally and the 18th rank within Uttar Pradesh in the NIRF Engineering category. Additionally, the university's athletes have won 304 medals in various national competitions.
